Construction

Ferrell/Brown will provide us a formal update at the meeting. Construction on the Del Rio Campus is wrapping up. We are finalizing our furniture request and waiting for May Graduation to move our portable building to finish up the parking area in front of the Admin. Building.

Future Expansion

Eagle Pass – We have narrowed down the site layout for the Eagle Pass Campus. We will be requesting Board approval on the site location and layout for the new construction. If board approves the project site/layout, the architect will begin the design phase.

Crystal City – We are working with Crystal City ISD to repurpose an existing ISD facility into a joint use welding lab. Once we move further along with that project, we will proceed with the installation of the metal building donated by Crystal City for a HVAC lab and wellness center. Architect will resume the planning for the Library Resource Center for our Crystal City Campus. We anticipate to make a presentation to their City Council in May.
